

Audiologist Job Description

Job Overview

Responsible for rendering professional audio care and related services within the medical practice in support of the physicians. To provide quality patient care, satisfaction and meet regulatory requirements, the Audiologist performs the following duties:

Primary Responsibilities

- Maintaining a valid Wisconsin audiology license and clinical competency as per the current ASHA (American Speech-Language-Hearing Association) guidelines.
- Clinical audiological testing of patients of all ages. This includes performing and interpreting all tests that fall within the realm of audiology, including but not limited to: newborn hearing screening, audiograms, tympanograms, stapedial reflexes, otoacoustic emissions, auditory brainstem response, central auditory processing disorder evaluation, electrocochleography, videonystagmography, computerized dynamic posturography, and concussion testing.
- Performing evaluations, programming, repair and service of all hearing devices, including but not limited to: hearing aids, cochlear implants and other surgically implanted hearing devices, and all other environmental enrichment and assistive listening devices.
- Counseling patients with all types of hearing problems.
- Overseeing the dispensing and sale of all amplification and assistive listening devices for patients, including but not limited to: those worn on their person, at work, school or home.
- Ability to travel between different office locations as needed.
- Ensures that all equipment in testing and consultation rooms is cleaned, disinfected and properly set up prior to each patient encounter.
- Cleans and restocks examining rooms for the day's use.
- Assists in maintaining all clinical equipment to include sterilizing, if applicable. Evaluates all equipment for damage.
- Giving community information talks concerning hearing and aural rehabilitation and actively seeking audiological screening in the communities where the Employees practice primarily and where they perform outreach.
- Writing patient audiological evaluation reports when necessary and in a timely fashion, as defined by the practice Policy Manual.
- Maintains strict confidentiality in accordance with HIPAA regulations.
- Performs other duties as necessary.
- Be willing and able to supervise students of audiology.
- Supervising the work of any hearing instrument specialist or audiology technician employed within the practice.
