PSG Technologist responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Performs basic and advanced diagnostic sleep studies
- Prepares patient equipment for testing
- Explains pre and post testing procedures
- Monitors patient throughout testing and intervenes when necessary to resolve patient needs or equipment issues
- Calibrates, repairs and maintains equipment for testing
- Provides PSG recordings and all technical duties related to the PSG evaluation of sleep disorders
- Analyzes data, scores polysomnograms and compiles data into a report for physician review
- Accountability for the operations of the sleep department
- Oversees the quality of patient care provided
